



1 INTRODUCTION

2000/2001 was a historic year of firsts in the academic history of the College. It saw the launch of the first Graduate Diploma Of Family Medicine (GDFM) programme, as well as the successful exit of the first batch of Fellows by Assessment. The Council also approved the Family Medicine Fellowship Programme (Aged Care).

4 THE FIRST COHORT OF FELLOWS BY ASSESSMENT

The first batch of Fellows by assessment were assessed to have completed their programme after successfully traversing the final hurdle, the panel of interviewers for the exit interview on 16 September 2000. The Exit Panel consisted of an external interviewer, Prof Wes Fabb, A/Prof Goh Lee Gan, Dr Alfred Loh, immediate past President and Dr Lau Hong Choon, Censor-in-Chief. The assessment of the interview panel was that these doctors were worthy of the conferment of the FCFPS by virtue of their achievements and diligence in completing the two-year programme. The fellowship programme was rigorous as it was structured to ensure discipline in completing case studies and to show proof of excellent practice. The successful Fellows were:



3 THE FIRST GRADUATE DIPLOMA OF FAMILY MEDICINE (GDFM) PROGRAMME

The GDFM was officially launched on 1 July 2000. The Guest of Honour was DMS Prof Tan Chor Chuan. VIP guests include Mr Tan Tee How, CEO, NHG, Dr Lam Sian Lian, Chairman of the Family Medicine Committee, Dr Lim Kim Leong, past Censor-in-Chief, Dr Ling Sing Lin, DDMS (Elderly Care and Continuing Care), Dr Agnes Tan, Director Manpower, Singhealth, Dr Shanta Emmanuel NHG Polyclinics CEO and Dr Paul Goh, Singhealth Polyclinics CEO. Many of the guests present were instrumental in the development of Family Medicine.

However what belies the significance of the event was that the College had begun to bridge the academic gap among GPs and medical officers. It has been recognised that the MMed (Family Medicine) may not address the general needs of busy GPs and medical officers who may not have the time or intention to pursue the more arduous


Masters Programme but nevertheless are able to take a useful Family Medicine Programme leading to a diploma.

The programme started with 28 tutors with the MMed (FM) qualification and 48 "trainees". It was led by A/Prof Cheong Pak Yean, Director of the programme with A/Prof Goh Lee Gan as a key advisor and contributor. The structure and components of the GDFM was reported in the previous Censors' Report. All the tutors underwent a 'Train-the-Trainer' programme to familiarise themselves with the programme. They were then linked with their trainees. During the launch of the programme, the trainees were paired with their respective trainers.






Programme B accounted for one-third (31) of the total (104) who obtained MMed(FM) since 2006.

- For the first 2 decades, the Collegiate membership was the academic standard.
- The third decade saw the development of the MMed(FM) programme for both public and private sectors doctors, the Fellowship by assessment & the Graduate diploma (GDFM) programme. The Collegiate membership (by interview) was also revived.
- In the last ten years, an alternative path to Collegiate membership from GDFM by assessment was instituted, a 1year programme to MMed(FM) from GDFM started and in the public sector, a 3-year residency programme was inaugurated.
