Significant Events

Family Practice Register

The 2005/06 work year of the College was significant for the announcement of the MOH Public Consultation Paper on the Proposed Establishment of the Family Physician Register. This generated passionate discussion during the MOH initiated feedback sessions with DMS Prof Satku and SMS Health Dr Balaji Sadasivan.

Para. 22 of the Public Consultation Paper stated that "setting training standards alone without addressing other practice related issue may prevent us from achieving the desired outcomes" This view was reiterated by the doctors during the MOH and College initiated feedback sessions as well as by the 20th Council in its feedback to the MOH on the Public Consultation Paper.

Courses

It is anticipated there will be increased demand for the GDFM course and MOP modules from practicing GPs to enable them to fulfill the criteria to be on the FP Register. The College has made preparations to increase capacity for the provision of these courses in collaboration with the two health clusters.

Constitutional Review

The President of our College had advocated in the Sept 2005 issue of The College Mirror that a review and amendment of the College Constitution be conducted. A Constitution Review Committee was formed and the proposals for the moment are (1) the change of the quorum to 50 voting members or 1/8 of the voting membership whichever is the lower instead of the 1/8 membership requirement, and (2) the use of voting methods that will facilitate greater participation of the eligible members. Further amendments will be considered when the Ministry of Health's Family Practice Register is finalised.

Academic Programmes

Graduate Diploma In Family Medicine

In the year under review, there were 42 graduands in the 4th Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine programme out of the 50 who sat for the programme. The Examination was held in July 2005.

The examination consists of the following components which have to be passed at the same sitting:

 A 2-hour multiple choice question paper 	25%
 A 1-hour key feature problem theory paper 	25%
 A 2-hour Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) 	50%

- 2. Attainment of the MMed (FM) Singapore





MCFP by Assessment and the College Professional Development Programme (CPDP)

The MCFP by Assessment award was mooted to upgrade existing criteria for award of the Collegiate membership and bring it in line with international standards and the global trend of award by objective assessment and validation of training.

Entry requirement is the attainment of the GDFM or equivalent academic degree, professional good standing and ordinary membership of the College for at least 2 years.

The CPDP programme which leads to the award by assessment comprise a course of 3 modules and the normal duration of the programme is 2 years. Completion within 1 year is allowed if the candidate can complete the modules within 1 year.

The modules are: Consulting, Communication and Counselling Skills Course Clinical Quality Skills Course Professional Development Project

A summative assessement is carried out at the end of the programme and successful candidates will be awarded the MCFP(S).

The MCFP by assessment and the CPDP was launched at the commencement of the academic year 2004. The exit assessment will be in May 2006.

Institute of Family Medicine

The Institute of Family Medicine was formed in 2001. In the year under review it continued to be headed by A/Prof Goh Lee Gan as its Consultant. He is assisted by our Executive Director, Dr Lee Kheng Hock. The role of the IFM is to develop the academic programmes of the College. It serves as a think tank in family medicine training. A part-time teaching faculty consisting of four faculty members Drs Julian Lim, Kwong Kum Hoong, Ong Chooi Peng, and Tan Yew Seng were appointed to further improve the quality of the training materials. New content, programme and training concepts were also introduced.

The Institute of Family Medicine also oversees the Family Medicine Fellowship Programme, the Family Medicine Membership Programme, and the Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine.

Continuing Professional Development Activities

Continuing Medical Education

The College is represented in the SMC CME Co-ordinating Committee and works closely with the Singapore Medical Council to ensure that the quality of the CME events is acceptable. It continues to advise the SMC on the accreditation of Core Family Medicine CME events through its panel of FM CME advisors appointed by the College. The Singapore Medical Council had formed an Accreditation of CME Providers Workgroup. It is in the process of revising the criteria as to the bodies that should be allowed to apply for accreditation and organise CME activities.

E-Learning

The E-learning programme launched in 2003 has been incorporated into the GDFM training programme. It will take on an increasingly important role as the IT adoption rate of doctors improve. The cost effectiveness of e-learning in reaching CME and professional development standards will make this an increasingly attractive learning method. The e-learning platform of the College is undergoing a major revamp and will be ready to take on more users by January 2007.

Family Practice Skills Course

With the College increasingly taking on the role of evaluating and accreditating CME programmes, it has consistently adhered to the policy of not co-organising and providing nominal sponsorships to events organised by healthcare service providers and commercial organisations. The College had also stopped organising ad-hoc events and instead focused on structured courses that are crafted to meet the needs of practising family physicians. The Family Practice Skills Courses was developed for such a purpose.

Taking into consideration our limited resources and manpower, the College set itself to produce a minimum of 4 courses per year. Where resources permit, more may be conducted within a year.

Components of the Course:

- Distance learning course six units
- Two Seminars
- One Clinical Teaching Session
- Reading papers: A Selection of 10 papers will be presented. Course participants are advised to choose up to five for self-study.

The components may vary from course to course according to requirements.

As of 31st March 2006, the following family practice skills courses have been organised:

- Vaccinations and Prevention of Infectious Diseases
- Clinical Quality
- Development in Diagnosis and Management
- Women's Health

College Activities

Convocation 2005

The annual convocation and dinner was held on the 1st October 2005 and the Guest of Honour was Professor K Satkunanantham, Director of Medical Services. His keynote address was on the setting up of the Family Physician Register.

The Sreenivasan Oration was also held in conjunction with the convocation dinner. Professor Thomas Stuart Murray, Director of Postgraduate General Practice Education, NHS Education for Scotland was invited as the Sreenivasan Orator 2005. He spoke on the topic "The Resourcing of Quality Primary Care".

The inauguration of the College Convocation Tapestry was a highlight of the evening. The Tapestry was donated by Dr Wong Heck Sing to commemorate the formation of the Institute of Family Medicine.

Visit by Indonesian Family Medicine Study Team

A study team of 26 strong made up of Family Medicine teachers, practitioners, office bearers from the Indonesian Medical Association, the Association of Family Physicians of Indonesia and staff from the Ministry of Health of Republic of Indonesia visited Singapore on a training course from 28 Mar -10 Apr hosted by Singapore International Foundation (SIF) under its Singapore Volunteers Overseas (SVO) Programmes. The delegates came from different corners of Indonesia: Jakarta, Yogyakarta and Solo in Central Java, Palembang in South Sumatra and also Surabaya.

The study team visited the College and had discussion on professional development of family physicians.

Kyoto WONCA Asia Pacific Conference (27/5-01/6/2005)

The WONCA 2007 HOC sent a team of seven delegates to promote the world event to be held in Singapore in 2007. The members were Dr Tan See Leng, A/Prof Goh Lee Gan, Dr Chng Woei, Dr Wong Weng Hong, Dr Lee Kheng Hock, Dr Lim Fong Seng and Dr Matthew Ng.

There was a record turnout of 1800 delegates comprising 1300 local and some 500 international participants.

Our President, A/Prof Cheong Pak Yean was at the Conference to deliver a keynote lecture on depression. Dr Tan Ngiap Chuan, A/Prof Goh Lee Gan and Ng Chirk Jenn together ran a workshop on qualitative research.

Visit By Dr David Cunningham and Dr Rodney Nan Tie

College Workgroup for Influenza Pandemic Preparedness Introduction

CFPS has formed a College Workgroup for Influenza Pandemic Preparedness. This will allow us at the appropriate time to participate in activities like drafting advisories and organizing seminars to heighten awareness and knowledge of family physicians in influenza pandemic preparedness using the model of the College SARS workgroup formed during the 2003 SARS outbreak.

Terms of reference

- (1) To be informed of the latest in the medical and scientific researches on influenza that has bearing on primary care pandemic preparedness;
- (2) To provide a forum for the various sectors in primary care to interact with each other and with the Ministry as to the roles primary care providers can play in the influenza pandemic preparedness for the nation; and
- (3) To communicate with all family physicians relevant information through various medium such as advisories and seminars.

INTRODUCTION

The major event of the year for the family medicine fraternity was the announcement of the proposed family physician register. It signifies a commitment of the Ministry of Health to transform primary care and to develop family medicine to the level that it will make significant contributions to the effort to meet the challenge of chronic diseases. The programme to improve standards and skill levels is the opening move of a series of initiatives that will transform primary care. Family medicine will soon take on its rightful role in improving the health of Singaporeans within our national health care delivery system.

The Censors Board finds new impetus to refine criteria and standards. It will work closely with the Interim Joint Committee of Family Medicine Training and eventually the Family Physician Accreditation Board. We urge members to support this initiative which will eventually restore the esteem of the family doctor in the eyes of our patients and our peers.

THE GRADUATE DIPLOMA OF FAMILY MEDICINE (GDFM) EXAMINATION 2004

COLLEGE'S ROLE AS CME PROVIDER

The Family Practice Skills Course (FPSC) is a structured CME programme formulated to meet the increasing need for relevant skills training which complements our College's structured training programmes. It was started to meet the need of better CME training programmes when CME became mandatory on 1st January 2003. It would meet the needs of three groups of doctors:

- Those who attend certain components of the FPSC for Core FM CME. This is likely to be the biggest group;
- Those who attend all the components of an FPSC to qualify for skills certification;
 and
- Those enrolled in the GDFM who attend it as part of their elective skills course requirements.

Category 1B Applications:

Each FPSC may comprise a mixture of the following components:

- 1. Distance Learning with verification
- Lectures
- 3. Workshops
- 4. Small group activities including clinical attachments, tutorials, ward-rounds
- 5. Assessments which can be written, oral, demonstration and/or clinical

The first and second components are published in the Singapore Family Physician and sent to all members as well as those who have registered for the course. To date, 16 FPSC courses have been organised since its inception on 27th October 2002.

The six FPSCs that were held during the year are on the subjects of:

- Obesity
- Vaccinations & Prevention of Infectious Diseases
- Clinical Quality
- Developments in Diagnosis and Management
- Women's Health
- Dementia

Some statistics of participation for these courses held from the period 1 April 2005 to 31 March 2006 is given in Table 2.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The CRC will review the constitution of the CFPS and recommend to the Council, constitutional amendments that will further the objectives of the College in the context of the new environment. The review will include the following areas:

- 1. The quorum required for constitutional amendments of the College. Presently the quorum required is one-eighth of the voting membership.
- 2. The eligibility and rights of the various categories of membership.
- The process of nominating and electing leaders of the College.
- 4. The roles of the Council, the Censor Board and the executives in charge of College organisations such as the Institute of Family Medicine (IFM).
- 5. Organisational changes that are necessary to support the proposed Family Medicine Register.

DELIBERATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE

Quorum required for Constitutional amendments

The first line of Article VIII (Meetings), Section 6 in the existing Constitution which is "The quorum for a General Meeting shall not be less than 1/8 of the voting membership." will be amended to "The quorum for a General Meeting shall not be less than 50 voting members."

Eligibility and rights of the various categories of membership

It was decided to leave this item till after the Family Practice Register (FPR) is established by the SMC.

Process of nominating and electing leaders of the College

Voting will be by methods that will make it easy for all eligible voters to participate:

- (a) postal voting
- (b) automated telephone voting or
- (c) other methods that are available at the time.

Voting will be held in accordance to the Constitution requirements.

Article IX (Council of the College), Section 4 will have the following appended to the existing text. "An Election Committee will be appointed to oversee the nomination and election processes. Details of these processes will be specified in the College by-laws."

The following will be included in the by-laws: "The Election Committee should consist of past office-bearers and the Fellows of the College who are not within the present Council. The number of members is between 3 to 5. Temporary Staff can also be employed to assist the Committee if necessary."

Roles of the Council, the Censor Board and the executives in charge of the College organisations such as the Institute of Family Medicine(IFM)

There will be no change in the number of Council members.

Article IX (Council of the College) has covered most of the issues pertaining to the roles of the Council, the Censor Board and the executives in charge of the College.

Organisational changes that are necessary to support the proposed Family Physician Register

These will be proposed in the future when the details of the Family Physician Register are established.

Response from members

No objections to the Constitutional Review have been received.

The proposed changes in Table 1 will be submitted for comments and approval by the College legal advisors and Dr Lee Suan Yew as the College Advisor. The changes in the Constitutional Review will be presented to the forthcoming AGM for adoption.

The Department of COFM conducted a Trainers' Retreat on 16 January 2006 to review the 4-week Family Medicine posting. Arising out of the review, the posting was reorganised so that the students spend a full day on Mondays and Fridays in the campus to learn the fundamentals of family medicine and practice issues. A day of attachment to the community hospital was also included for the first time to provide the interface between hospital care and subacute care. The one day teaching and clinical exposure on palliative care is continued. The one day attachment to private paediatricians have been discontinued as the students felt that the exposure at the polyclinic was adequate to outpatient primary care paediatric problems. Thanks are due to the small band of private paediatricians who have contributed to the teaching of the undergraduates in the last 5 years (from 2000 to 2005).

The continuous assessment is also provided by the GP tutors and the Polyclinic tutors. The four case write-ups and a written end-of-posting test also add to the total continuous assessment mark.

As has been through the years, the posting would not have been possible without the contribution of some 40 GP tutors per batch and some similar number of polyclinic tutors. Then there are also the 15 teachers in palliative care as well doctors in the community hospital. Their names are given on the next two pages.

On behalf of the University and the College of Family Physicians, the College's Undergraduate Committee is grateful for the support and appreciates the efforts of one and all in making the posting useful, meaningful and interesting to the students.

The Host Organizing Committee (HOC) had a watershed year this year in its marketing and promotional activities. The HOC brought on board a marketing manager on a retainer(S\$2000 per month) and commission basis (see attached table) to beef up its outreach to pharmaceutical and health care companies to sponsor the 2007 world conference. Ms Christine Tan with extensive experience in convention marketing and events management came on board in October 2005 and has been actively supporting the committee on its marketing and outreach programs.

For the first quarter of this year, our HOC has been able to secure a generous platinum sponsorship grant from GSK and also commitment of sponsorship of a bursary from NTUC Income covering the registration fees of about 100 family physicians from regional countries. In addition, the committee has also received widespread indications of interest and verbal commitments from various health care companies and pharmaceutical companies totalling more than S\$500,000 at the moment. The HOC is cautiously optimistic that they would be able to raise sponsorships in excess of S\$750,000 by the conference and is working actively to secure more commitments from interested parties.

On the scientific programs end, the scientific committee has put together an extremely interesting program and keynote committed plenary speakers include local as well as quite a number of internationally acclaimed speakers. Committed speakers include foreign dignatories like Dr Spencer Wells from National Geographic who is the key driver of the largest project to map out the transmigration of DNA out from the African Rift Valley to the rest of the world, Dr Francis Collins who is the key driver of The Human Genome Project from the US, Dr Omi Shigeru from the World Health Organization and a possible Nobel Prize Laureate who is presently checking his schedule and will revert by end June this year. Local dignatories include Professor Edison Liu from our Genomic Institute of Singapore.

The HOC as part of its obligation to Wonca's house rules hosted the Chair of the last Wonca World Conference (Orlando-2004) in February this year. Dr Dan Ostergaard was particularly impressed with our hospitality as well as the choice of venue for the conference at Suntec City and Convention Center and has given the blessings to go ahead with the booking of the venue for the world conference. The HOC will be sending teams to most family medicine conferences this year and the first quarter of next year to capitalize on the marketing outreach programs to secure more delegates at our conference next year.

Our HOC would also like to take this opportunity to invite all college members to turn up in full force to support our conference next year as this would possibly be a once or twice in a lifetime event to be cherished.





Heraldry of the College

The upper portion of the badge of the College consists of a golden lion in a passant stance superimposed on the chief which is red in colour.

The lion represents our nation of Singapore. Red is the colour of blood which is the precious liquid on which life depends and which is our mission to save.

The lower portion of the badge consists of a green cross superimposed on a white shield. The green cross symbolizes the humanitarian mission of our College. White is the colour of purity which is our aim.

On the green cross is superimposed an open book and a caduceus. The open book represents knowledge and continued learning and the caduceus is the recognized symbol for the art of healing."
