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INTRODUCTION

The management of bronchial asthma has taken further steps forward. The current strategy is to aim for total asthma control, at least for the great majority - which is the freedom from day time symptoms, limitation of daily activities, nocturnal symptoms, need for reliever treatment, no exacerbations, and normal or near-normal lung function test results. This strategy is described in recent clinical practice guidelines such as the 2008 MOH CPG on management of asthma, the NHLBI 2007 EPR3 guidelines, and the 2007 GINA guidelines To implement this strategy of asthma control, there is a need for a good knowledge and skills in the assessment of control, pharmacotherapy, and intensive asthma care education. There is also a need to know the utility of the ACT, PEF measurements, and spirometry in the total management of asthma control. These aspects will all be dealt with in this family practice skills course.
